## OVERVIEW OF THE FBI'S CODIS PROGRAM AND NDIS

The Combined DNA Index System or CODIS as it is known, has matured into a program supporting DNA databases in law enforcement laboratories in the all 50 States and the US Military. Internationally, there are 69 CODIS sites in 35 countries. As DNA database programs evolve, CODIS software has and will continue to accommodate the changing needs of the DNA community.

A major component of the CODIS program is operation of the National DNA Index System or NDIS. NDIS is the National DNA Database. This National Index is made up of over 190 DNA Laboratories from all 50 States as well as the FBI Laboratory and United States Army Crime Laboratory. Currently there are almost 10 million Offender DNA profiles and over 375,000 Crime Scene DNA profiles.

An update will be provided on the development of CODIS 7.0, the National DNA Index System, and expanding the CODIS core loci in the United States.
